Patrick Sharrett's excellent, if somewhat unfortunately named, 'Passing Exams for Dummies' is an important primer on both the

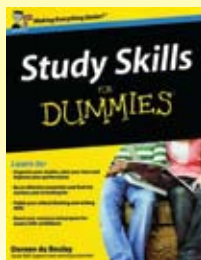
